

# What is the General Plan?

### "Blueprint" for City thru 2040

- » Contains community's "Vision"
  - Vision Statement
  - Goals, Policies and Programs to implement

#### » For decision makers and staff

Serves as guide for future decision making

#### » For the community

• Documents community interests, balances growth and quality of life

#### City Council: Engage a broad spectrum of the community

- » Noise



## **General Plan Update Goals**

- » Engage broad spectrum of the community
- » Establish the community's vision for San Mateo in 2040
- » Identify major issues to address
- » Provide tools to achieve the vision and address issues
- » Incorporate objectives from other City planning efforts
  - Sustainable Streets Plan
  - Rail Corridor Plan and Bay Meadows Specific Plan implementation
  - Clean Water Program
  - Pedestrian Master Plan
  - Downtown Plan Update
  - Bicycle Master Plan Update
  - Climate Action Plan Update (will begin soon)

# Challenges

# » Changing Population

- Five generations and growing
- » Economic Sustainability
- » Transportation/Circulation
- » Housing Availability and Affordability





# **Outreach to Diverse Groups**



- » Meetings are recorded








# **General Plan Vision Statement**

- » Describes the future of San Mateo as you would like it to be in 2040
- » Expresses shared community values
- » Relates to all topics in the General Plan
- » Guides preparation of General Plan goals and policies





# From Vision to Policy: Example

#### » Vision Statement

*"Everyone in San Mateo has access to many convenient ways to get around town."* 

» **Goal** (desired outcome)

Increased Transit Ridership


» **Policy** (one of potentially multiple directives to achieve the goal)

Work with employers to expand shuttles to Caltrain
