Just wanted to let you know that the city staff person who joined our group at the end of our session (I think her name was Jennifer) kind of took over the end of the group's activity of trying to come up with a vision / mission statement. I think the staff should let the group build a final statement with as many "ands" as needed. Our group kind of ended up with a "fluff" circulation statement, whereas other groups really had very specific statements. (I was in group 1 at the King center on 12/2 - so you might be able to check to see who the city staff was that joined our group for the last 10-15 minutes).

For me - I think I cannot repeat this enough - the City Council needs to wait until the current construction on Delaware is at full capacity BEFORE WE APPROVE ANY MORE BUILDING ANYWHERE. The traffic mess we've got MUST be resolved with roadway improvements, before we end up with gridlock not only at morning and evening rush hours, but potentially all day long on the 19th / Fashion Island, Delaware corridors.

I am active with San Mateans for Responsive Government - and Rick Bonilla, Diane Papan and Joe Goethals need to get "on the same page" as Eric Rodriguez and Maureen Freschet. I want to be able to go over to BridgePoint at 3:00 PM without spending 30-45 minutes waiting in traffic. I can't imagine that isn't the goal of ALL the members of our City Council.
