One comment made by a young man at a City Council meeting was: "High rises use a lot less water than single-family homes because they don't have lawns." I was stunned by the dumbness of this comment, but it does offer an insight into the thought process.

May we have more discussion about the basic realities of water, traffic, schools, etc., to balance the excitement of turning the Peninsula into a collection of tower blocks?
