Greetings City Council Members,

How many times do the residents of San Mateo need to say "NO" to disregarding the elements of Measure Y?

Time and time again the residents have spoken up and demanded the City Council (and Commissions) stop being the pawns of developers and HEAR, LISTEN to and ABIDE by what the residents want.

Perhaps the City Attorney could brief some of the council members and commissioners on what is meant by D-E-M-O-C-R-A-C-Y.

It appears that Mayor Lee was the only person present at the March 6th meeting who didn't clearly hear, or understand, the decisions made by council to:

- 1) Take High 2 off the table for Residential and Mixed Use (agreed to 8 stories with 2 more for density bonus)
- 2) Conduct a survey to test ballot language, not on the desirability of Measure Y
